Length of the Article and Citation Style

Original articles should be accompanied by a structured abstract of not more than 200 words on a separate page.

Original manuscripts of articles are should generally be up to 3000 words in length and Analysis of not more than 2000 words; a double-spaced page with one inch margins using regular 12 fonts size. Longer manuscripts will be considered but we reserve the right to edit all manuscripts for length.

<u>Format</u>

Authors should submit a copy of manuscript in Microsoft Word, in English. Manuscripts may also be submitted as attachments to electronic mail.

<u>Citation</u>

Articles should conform to the Uniform System of Citation (17th ed.), i.e. Donald E. Bierderman & Others, "Law and Business of the Entertainment Industries", 3rd Ed., Praeger Publishers at p. 1-5. Author should provide a short biographical note in not more than fifty (50) words. And please indicate Intellectual Property speciality area in which you research or practice.

Deadline

Deadline for submission of written materials to the two editions of the Journal shall be March and October of each year. Articles that are not processed on time for this edition will be published in the next edition.
